

#### Fourth: The Royal Compartments:

The area of this compartment is (250m<sup>2</sup>), ornamented with Islamic engravings, and a cooper chandelier in the centre of the dome.

#### Fifth: The Main Conference Hall:

The hall has a capacity to house (400) persons; the capacity can be raised to (500). It is equipped with A/C and simultaneous translation system.



#### Sixth: The Library:

This center has a public library with an area of (400m<sup>2</sup>), in addition to the required warehouses. It is equipped with all requirements including furniture, equipment and A/C systems.



#### Seventh: The Administration Offices:

The total area of these offices is (200m<sup>2</sup>).

#### Eighth: The Reception Hall:

The area of this hall is (180m<sup>2</sup>).

#### Ninth: The House for Teaching Holy Qur'an:

The area of this house is (80m<sup>2</sup>).

#### Tenth: Closed Halls and Annexes:

The area of these units is (900m<sup>2</sup>).

#### Eleventh: The Cafeteria:

The area of the cafeteria is (100m<sup>2</sup>).

#### Twelfth: The Islamic Museum:

The area of this Museum is (150m<sup>2</sup>). It consists of two

wings; one is allocated for the martyr, the late King Abdullah Bin Al-Hussein (may God rest his soul in peace) where some of his personal acquisitions, and photos of his rich life, are kept. The second wing consists of the message of the Great Messenger of God (peace and God's blessing be upon him) addressed to the Roman Emperor Heraclius kept in the custody of H.M. the late King Al-Hussein Bin Talal. (may God rest his soul in peace) This is in addition to pieces of antiquities, Islamic coins, a number of Islamic stone engravings and wall plates carrying information about the message of Islam to humanity, the Islamic areas and the text of the pledge of allegiance, as Caliph and Prince of the believers, given to the Late Al-Hussein Bin Ali in Shuna on 8 Sha'ban 1324 A.H., corresponding to 14/3/1924 A. D.



#### Thirteenth: The Charity Bazaar:

It consists of ten stores with an area of (220m<sup>2</sup>). It contains traditional items produced by the Islamic cultural Centres of the Woman's Affair Directorate. The Zakat's Committees for the purpose of marketing such products and distributing the earnings to the poor families. Besides this, the functions of this bazaar include organizing training courses on certain handicrafts for the benefits of the daughters of these families, sponsoring intellectual and cultural activities, publications and products of the Ministry of Awqaf.

#### Fourteenth: The Residential Flats:

There are three flats with an area of (500m<sup>2</sup>).

#### Fifteenth: The Car Parks:

The total area of these car parks is (8450m<sup>2</sup>), in three floors and have the capacity to house (250) cars.

#### Sixteenth: The External Flood Lighting:

The Ministry completed the flood lighting project for the mosque on 28/2/1995. The mosque walls, minarets and domes were provided with lighting to display their architectural aspects and give them

a distinguished aesthetic feature, thus making the mosque one of the most splendid landmarks of the city of Amman.

The apex of the minaret was provided with a laser beam sending its light to a distance of one kilometre in the sky f Amman to define the Kiblah's direction.

The cost of this project amounted to about one hundred and fifteen thousand dinars.

The total area of the mosque is (16,785m<sup>2</sup>) including (6,500m<sup>2</sup>) allocated for praying purposes with a capacity or about (10,000) worshippers.

Most of the materials used in the execution of the mosque's works were selected of local and natural materials. Most work's designs, execution and supervision were carried out by local Jordanian experts, along with some Arab experts from Egypt, Syria and Morocco.

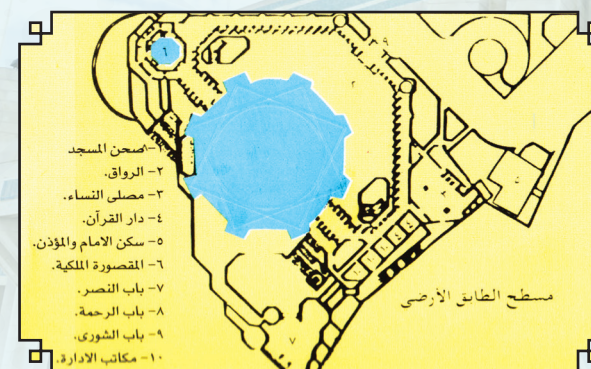
All the works of the two phases were executed by thirty five local Jordanian companies; for a total cost of 5,183,000 JDs. The mosque requirements, design and supervision of the first phase were carried out under the supervision of the Ministry.

This had a great effect in terms of the reduction of cost, improvement of works quality and completion of works in record time.

#### 3) The Third Phase:

The Ministry of Awqaf has purchased a number of neighboring pieces of land and allocated them for the construction of additional installations for the purpose of completing this Islamic Cultural Centre in order to represent the modern Hashemite civilization launched by the martyr, the late King Abdullah Bin Al-Hussein. All the required studies and designs have already been prepared. The works of the third phase include the construction of The following units:-

- 1) An Islamic Cultural Centre for Children.
- 2) Multi Purpose hall.
- 3) Traditional malls.
- 4) Small halls for several activities.
